

Care of Bonsai Tools

The best care you can give to tools is to clean them after each use. They should never need major work if they are kept clean. Tools should be cleaned thoroughly with soap and water or rubbing alcohol after each use, and then dried carefully. WD-40 is good for removing the tough stains from the cutting surfaces of the tools left by plants which exude a sticky sap. After each cleaning, dry your tools and oil lightly with Three-In-One (available at Home Depot).

If you need to sharpen your tools, sharpening stones need to be smooth and flat. Coarse or medium stones are desirable for heavy work, such as removing a nick in the blade. The finishing touches require a fine stone.

After cleaning and sharpening tools, tools should be oiled lightly. Excess oil should be wiped away. With regular cleaning, sharpening and oiling, your bonsai tools can be at your service for decades.
